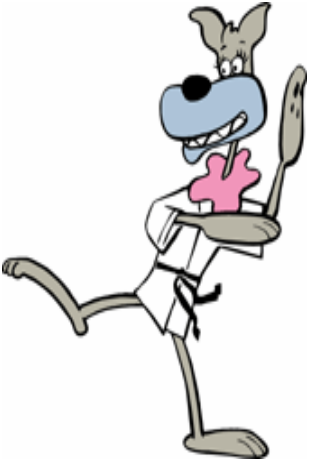

- Scouts keep the laws of their land

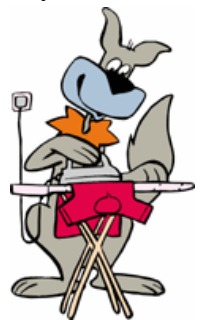


To help other people

The Scout sign is also made with the right hand. Can you make this and say when it is used?

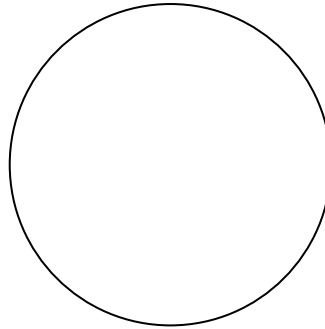


The Moving-On Award – My Scout Group

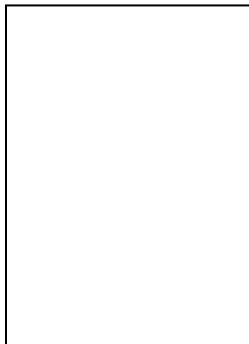
I belong to the Scout Group.

Membership badge

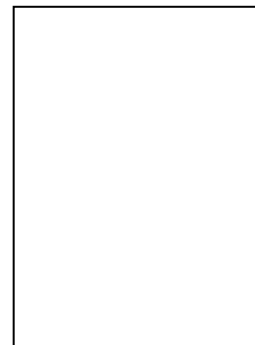


My District badge.

The Moving-On Award – Joining the Pack

When Beaver Scouts move on to Cubs, there are a number of badges that they can transfer from their Beaver uniform to their Cub uniform.

These are:

- **Beaver Scout Joining in Badge (highest number only)**



- **Beaver Scout Moving on Award**



- **Chief Scout's Bronze Award**



- **Any Staged Activity Badges earned (highest number)**
